1 Fur, Feathers and Scales: Animal Update

The Balasaheb Thackeray Gorewada International Zoological Park has continued to enhance its wildlife collection and conservation efforts during this quarter through several key acquisitions and rescues. The zoo received Striped Hyenas and Indian Wolves from Jaipur, contributing to the diversity of its carnivore collection. To strengthen the genetic diversity of its herbivores, Spotted Deer and Black Buck were

introduced from Jamshedpur, while Porcupines, Hanuman Langurs, Indian Rock Pythons, and Hog Deer arrived from Ahmedabad. In a unique rescue operation, a Raccoon, found trapped in a shipping container at Mumbai's dockyard, was rescued by RAWW Mumbai and handed over to Gorewada Zoo for lifetime care, after receiving medical treatment.

2 Rehabilitation of Rescued Animals

Rewilding rescued animals at Gorewada Zoo is a critical conservation initiative aimed at restoring wildlife to their natural habitats. This process involves rehabilitating animals that have been rescued from human-wildlife conflicts, injuries, or illegal trade. At Gorewada Zoo, specialized care is provided to ensure the physical and behavioural health of these animals, preparing them for eventual release into the wild.

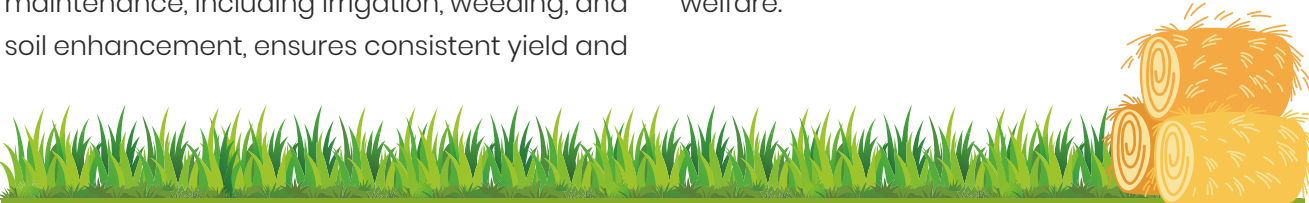

Fodder Plot in the Zoo

The in-house fodder plot at Gorewada Zoo plays a vital role in ensuring a sustainable and cost-effective supply of high-quality fodder for the herbivorous animals under its care. Spanning a 2Ha dedicated area within the zoo premises, the fodder plot is cultivated with nutrient-rich grasses and other forage crops tailored to meet the dietary needs of various species. Regular maintenance, including irrigation, weeding, and soil enhancement, ensures consistent yield and

quality. This initiative not only reduces dependency on external suppliers but also promotes eco-friendly practices by minimizing the carbon footprint associated with fodder transportation. The in-house fodder plot has significantly contributed to the zoo's self-reliance and operational efficiency, aligning with its long-term goals of sustainability and animal welfare.

Transplatation

Under the Habitat Development Program, Gorewada Zoo has undertaken the transplantation of old-growth Ficus trees disrupted by development activities to preserve the ecological balance and enhance the zoo's natural environment. This initiative not only salvages mature trees that would otherwise be lost but also ensures the continuity of habitats vital for local wildlife. By carefully uprooting and relocating these trees using advanced arboricultural techniques, the zoo aims to create a more authentic and sustainable habitat for its animal inhabitants while contributing to conservation efforts.



Weed Removal

As part of its commitment to maintaining healthy ecosystems, Gorewada Zoo has initiated a comprehensive program to remove invasive weeds from its animal safaris. These invasive species, which often compete native vegetation, pose a threat to the natural habitats of the zoo's resident wildlife. By clearing these weeds, the zoo not only restores the balance of

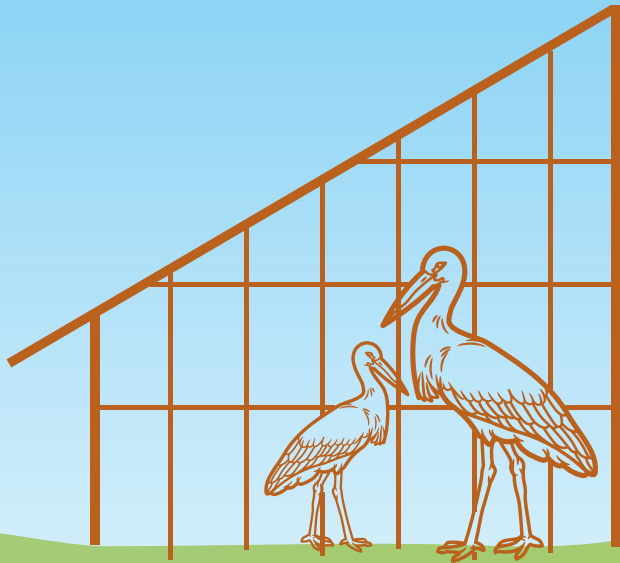

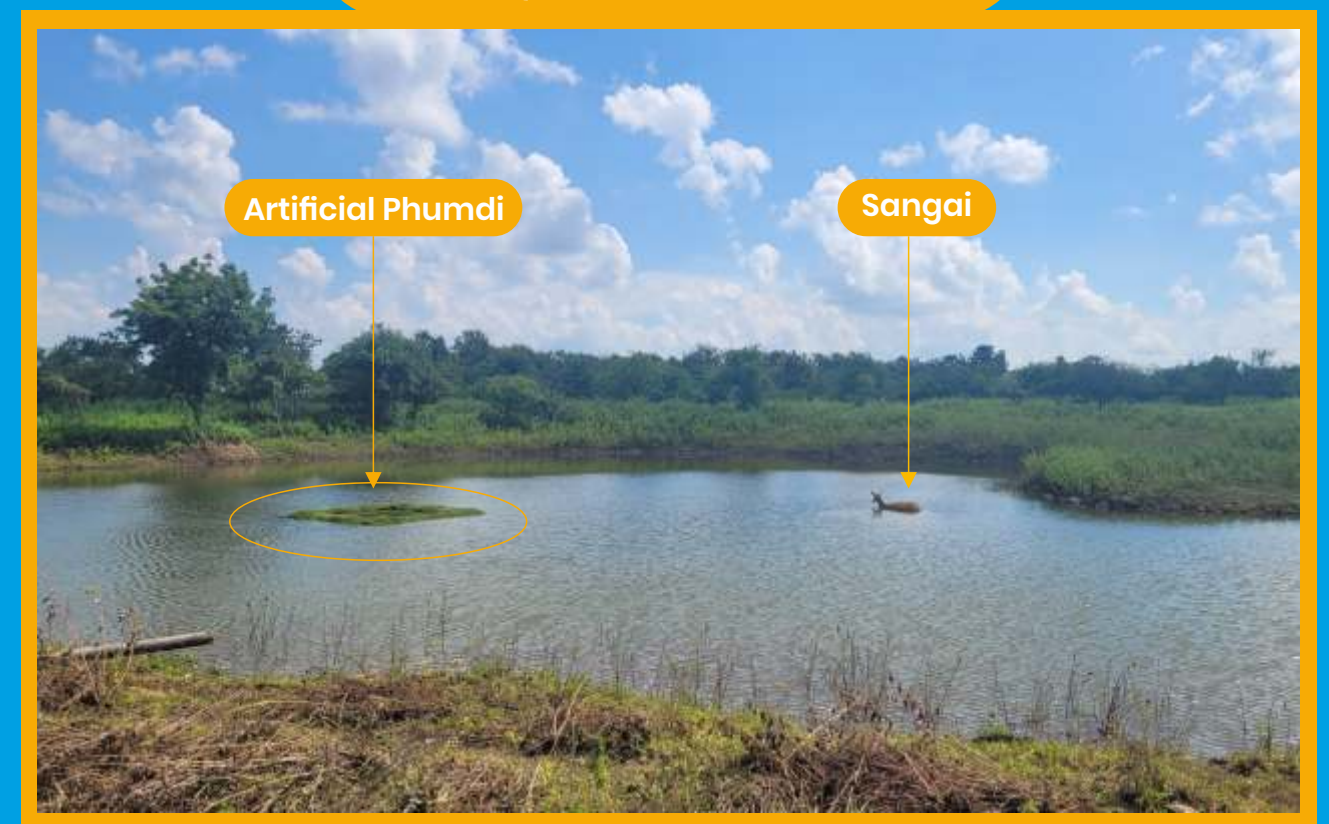

'Phumdi' – the Floating Island

Loktak lake in Manipur is a World Nature Heritage site due to its unique floating island habitats locally known as 'Phumdi'. These islands consist of vegetation, soil, and organic matter in various stages of decay. These islands provide unique refuge to a diverse range of flora and fauna, including the critically endangered Manipur Brow-antlered Deer aka Sangai deer. Keibulamjao National Park in Manipur serves to protect this critical habitat for the conservation of this rarest deer of the world.

Recognizing its ecological significance, Gorewada Zoo endeavoured to create a small replica through an artificial phumdi structure as part of an awareness and enrichment activity. Recreating these islands in herbivore safari aligns with zoo's strategy of creating habitat-based exhibits and educating visitors about the importance of wetland ecosystems.

This vegetation on island is well accepted by the animals and have survived grazing. Its natural appearance and good education value have added to the strong conservation message.

With the lessons learned from the initial experiment, the zoo strives to expand similar activities in future to bring such conservation messages.
